ABOUT

MoLab, Inc.'s Camp Spark – Igniting Knowledge! is offered when students in Leon County are on school breaks for the winter, spring, and throughout the summer. Sessions are presented at a local school or organization. Winter Camp Spark will be held at Cornerstone Learning Community located at 2524 Hartsfield Rd. Tallahassee, FL 32303 on December 22, 23, 29, 30, 31 and January 2. On January 5, MoLab will present Camp Spark in partnership with Independent Green Technologies located at 3945 W. Pensacola St. Tallahassee, FL 32304.

Winter Camp Spark will offer students 5 years old through the 8th grade the opportunity to participate in art and science activities in a fun, interactive, and safe environment. Each daily session will present campers the opportunity to explore science through creative play, experimentation, and inquiry-based learning experiences. The sessions present age appropriate curriculum and are designed to provide students with engaging educational activities that are both informative and entertaining.

Camp sessions are staffed by certified school teachers and/or MoLab, Inc. educators. MoLab, Inc. conducts Level 2 background screening on all employees/volunteers and maintains at least a 1:9 adult to child ratio. Campers will be divided into groups by grade level and each day will offer a new experience with age appropriate activities.

THEMES

December 22: Fizz, Bang, Build! - Kick off the break with a day of assorted science experiments in chemistry, weather wonders, and fabulous physics. Get hands-on and be creative!

December 23: Frozen Science – Burr, there are so many cool experiments you can do with ice. Explore phase changes, create fake snow, experiment with dry ice, and make your own ice cream as you explore the science of cold!

December 29: Eco Adventure – Explore Florida's backyard in the winter! Discover the survival skills of plants and animals, investigate habitats, create an observation journal, and get outdoors for live encounters.

December 30: Spy Kids Camp – Sharpen your investigation skills to gather clues and analyze evidence; and bring your artistic skills to sketch suspects. We need your expertise to solve a mystery!

December 31: World Travelers – Celebrate the New Year with a special count down that takes campers on an exciting journey discovering science and culture around the world. It's a New Year's Eve party of discovery!

January 2: Hogwarts Day School – Calling all Hogwarts students home for the winter holiday to a one day workshop designed to exercise wizardry skills. Subjects to be covered include: Potions, Herbology, Arithmancy, and the Care of a Magical Creature.

January 5: Solar Science at IGT – Experience the power and usefulness of the sun with Independent Green Technologies and other sustainable partners. Campers will get hands-on with solar energy and learn from the experts while creating solar ovens, sun sensitive bracelets, and solar art!

FEES

Daily Camp fees are \$45 per day which includes lunch and 2 snacks. Hours are from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.; drop off starts at 8:45 a.m. and pick up is until 4:15 p.m.

Sign up for 3 or more days and receive a discounted rate of \$43 per day. Register more than one camper and all additional siblings receive a discounted rate of \$43 per day.

Refunds will be given 2 weeks prior to the start of the camp session, minus an \$8 processing fee. Please allow 90 days in order to receive a refund for non-credit card payments.

EXTENDED CAMP CARE

Extended Camp care is available starting at 7:45 a.m. for \$5/day and until 6 p.m. for \$5/day. There will be a \$1/minute late fee charged for every minute that a camper remains past 6:00 p.m.

REGISTRATION

Payment in full is due with registration.

LOCATIONS

Campers will be dropped off and picked up at Cornerstone Learning Community located at 2524 Hartsfield Rd. Tallahassee, FL 32303 on December 22, 23, 29, 30, 31 and January 2.

On January 5, Campers will be dropped off and picked up at Independent Green Technologies (IGT) at TCC Campus located at 3945 W. Pensacola St. Tallahassee, FL 32304.

DROP OFF/PICK UP PROCEDURES

Campers must have an Authorization to Pick Up Camper form on file. Only individuals on the Authorization form with valid picture identification will be allowed to pick up. Campers must be signed-in and out each day by an adult. Forms are available on MoLab, Inc.'s website at www.tallymolab.org or by request. Forms will also be available on the first day of camp.

LUNCH OPTIONS

The cost of lunch is included in the camp fees. Each day campers will choose to order from either Marco's Pizza or Subway. From Marco's Pizza they may order either cheese or pepperoni pizza and will receive up to three slices. Subway provides bag lunch options which include a six inch sub (turkey and cheese, ham and cheese, veggie and cheese, or peanut butter and jelly) and a bag of chips. Ice water is served with lunch. An adjusted rate is not available should a camper choose to bring their own lunch for any reason. MoLab strives to accommodate a wide range of dietary needs. Please contact MoLab staff with any questions or special requests.

MEDICATIONS

Prescription and non-prescription medications will only be administered with a completed Authorization to Administer Medication form on file. Please note that only oral medications can be administered. Forms are available on MoLab, Inc.'s website at www.tallymolab.org or by request. Forms will also be available on the first day of camp.
