



## **MoLab, Inc.'s Camp Spark – Igniting Knowledge! Spring Session**

March 18 - 22 and 25, 2019

**REGISTRATION BEGINS January 21, 2019**

*Camp Spark makes learning fun and links Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics (STEAM) concepts to the real-world.*

### **ABOUT**

MoLab, Inc.'s Camp Spark – Igniting Knowledge! is offered when students in Leon County are on school breaks for the fall, winter, spring, and throughout the summer. Sessions are presented at a local school or organization. Spring Camp Spark will be held at St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 1700 North Meridian Road, Tallahassee, FL 32303.

Spring Camp Spark will offer students 5 years old through the 8th grade the opportunity to participate in art and science activities in a fun, interactive, and safe environment. Each daily session will present campers the opportunity to explore science through creative play, experimentation, and inquiry-based learning experiences. The sessions present age-appropriate curriculum and are designed to provide students with engaging educational activities that are both informative and entertaining.

Camp sessions are staffed by certified school teachers and/or MoLab, Inc. educators. MoLab, Inc. conducts Level 2 background screenings on all employees/volunteers and maintains at least a 1:9 adult to child ratio. Campers will be divided into groups by grade level and each day will offer a new experience with age-appropriate activities.

### **THEMES**

**Monday, March 18: Slime Time** - Enjoy a fun hands-on day exploring chemistry through mixing up slime. Some crazy concoctions will respond to force, change colors, sparkle, and even be edible. Wow, there are so many ways to make slime!

**Tuesday, March 19: Leonardo's Lab** – Explore art and science through the master of both worlds! Campers will get to make their own kitchen sculpting clay, explore flight, sketch from nature, and test their engineering skills.

**Wednesday, March 20: Prehistoric Planet** – Discover the wonders of prehistoric Earth with an exciting day of hands-on exploration. Measure a Brontosaurus, concoct primordial ooze, experiment with natural disasters, and more!

**Thursday, March 21: Go Green!** – The Earth is a great place to live - let's explore all the cool ways we can protect our planet. Get hands-on with solar science, make a terrarium, compile camp compost, and create recycle art!

**Friday, March 22: Pixar Party** – Investigate the scientific world through the eyes of our favorite Pixar pals! Enjoy ocean explorations with Nemo, kitchen chemistry with Ratatouille, and engineering with Cars – to infinity and beyond!

**Monday, March 25: Spark Smorgasbord** – What better way to wrap up a fun session of Camp Spark than with an assortment of our favorite STEAM activities! Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math – anything goes!

### **FEES**

Daily Camp fees are \$45 per day, which includes lunch and 2 snacks. Hours are from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.; drop off starts at 8:45 a.m. and pick up is until 4:15 p.m.

Sign up for 3 or more days and receive a discounted rate of \$43 per day. Register more than one camper and all additional siblings receive a discounted rate of \$43 per day.

Refunds will be given 2 weeks prior to the start of the camp session, minus an \$8 processing fee per daily session. Please allow 30 days in order to receive a refund for non-credit card payments.

For cancellations after the 2-week notice, ½ of the fees will be refundable.

For cancellations 1 week prior to the start of camp, refunds will NOT be issued.

### **EXTENDED CAMP CARE**

Extended Camp Care is available starting at 7:45 a.m. for \$5/day and until 6 p.m. for \$5/day. There will be a \$1/minute late fee charged for every minute that a camper remains past 6:00 p.m.

### **REGISTRATION**

Payment in full is due with registration.

Registrations will be confirmed once both the payment and registration forms are received.

### **LOCATION**

Spring Camp Spark will be held at St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 1700 North Meridian Road Tallahassee, FL 32303. Camp activities take place in designated classrooms in the education building or on the church grounds.

### **DROP OFF/PICK UP PROCEDURES**

Campers must have an Authorization to Pick Up Camper form on file. Only individuals on the Authorization form with valid picture identification will be allowed to pick up. Campers must be

signed-in and out each day by an adult. Forms are available on MoLab, Inc.'s website at [www.tallymolab.org](http://www.tallymolab.org) or by request. Forms will also be available on the first day of camp.

Campers will be dropped off and signed in and out at the Camp Spark table located behind the sanctuary and in front of the entrance to Sanders Hall. The doors to the camp location are on an automatic lock. Parents wishing to drop off after 9:15 a.m. or needing to pick up before 3:45 p.m. will need to call either Camp Director to be let in. Parents of campers enrolled in post camp will also need to call when they arrive. Please contact Trish at 850-264-6224 or Aimee at 850-591-6362.

### **LUNCH OPTIONS**

The cost of lunch is included in the camp fees. Each day campers will choose to order from either Marco's Pizza or Subway. From Marco's Pizza they may order either cheese or pepperoni pizza and will receive up to three slices. Subway provides bag lunch options which include a six inch sub (turkey and cheese, ham and cheese, veggie and cheese, or peanut butter and jelly) and a bag of chips. Ice water is served with lunch. An adjusted rate is not available should a camper choose to bring their own lunch for any reason. MoLab strives to accommodate a wide range of dietary needs. Please contact MoLab staff with any questions or special requests.

### **MEDICATIONS**

Prescription and non-prescription medications will only be administered with a completed Authorization to Administer Medication form on file. Please note that only oral medications can be administered. Forms are available on MoLab, Inc.'s website at [www.tallymolab.org](http://www.tallymolab.org) or by request. Forms will also be available on the first day of camp.

### **CAMPER CONDUCT**

MoLab is dedicated to providing a safe and amicable environment for our campers. We assume that all campers are attending camp because they want to be at Camp Spark. Should any irresolvable behavioral issues arise; the parent/guardian will be contacted. Following all reasonable recourse to correct the matter, MoLab reserves the right to request that the camper not be eligible to continue participation. In this event, parent/guardian will be asked to pick up the camper.
